**The Master of Science in Education, Option in Curriculum** offered on the Concord Campus is designed to provide advanced special preparation or competencies for elementary school teachers.

The Department of Teacher Education offers graduate programs to prepare teachers who are committed to improving school practices for California's diverse student populations and who can model such practices in their own classrooms. The Department of Teacher Education faculty is comprised of professors committed to preparing teachers and other educational professionals to be effective in California's diverse schools.

### SCHEDULING

The M.S. in Education is an evening program with courses scheduled to allow a student to complete the program in a two year period.

### APPLICATION

The Concord Campus operates on the quarter system with four quarters a year. Applications are accepted every quarter. Applicants who want to enroll at the Concord Campus must be eligible for admission as an upper division student. Upper division and graduate courses only are offered at the Concord Campus.

### Major Requirements

The MS in Education, Option in Curriculum requires 45 quarter units. All students must take the four "Core" classes. At least 22.5 units must be at the 6000-level. You will plan your program with a faculty advisor.

#### Basic Credential Program Courses (up to 7 quarter units)

Seven quarter units from a Multiple Subject or Single Subject Credential Program will count as part of your 45-unit masters program. Please note, however, that all courses in your masters program, including those "brought in" from a credential program, must have been completed within seven years of your date of graduation.

#### Core Classes (16 units)

Candidates complete four 4-unit core classes. Each is offered once a year in Concord:

- \* **TED 6300** (4) Foundations of Curriculum Development – in Concord each Fall
- \* **TED 6700** (4) Advanced Educational Psychology – in Concord each Spring
- \* **TED 6020** (4) Research in Education – in Concord each Winter – this class must be taken in your next-to-last quarter
- \* **TED 6901** (4) Graduate Synthesis – in Concord each Spring – this class must be taken in your last quarter

#### Additional 6000-Level Courses (7 units)

Two additional 6000-level courses will be offered in Concord-friendly formats each year:

- \* **TED 6230** (4) Reading and Language Arts: Developing Fluent Readers – in Concord each Winter
- \* **TED 6246** (3) The Critical Analysis of Children's Literature – each Spring this class will be offered either through distance learning (which means you may attend in either Hayward or Concord) or it will be offered in an online format.

#### Additional 5000-Level Course (4 units)

- \* **TED 5413** (4) Environmental Education in the Classroom - will be offered in Concord during the Fall of odd-numbered years.

## **Fifth-Year Classes Designed for Teachers with SB 2042 Credentials (19 units)**

Teachers with SB 2042 Multiple or Single Subject Credentials earn their Professional Clear Credential by (a) taking four fifth-year classes or (b) participating in a California Commission on Teacher Credentialing [CCTC] induction program. Teachers with older, Ryan Act Credentials earn their Clear Credential by taking some of the courses listed below. All candidates for either Clear Credential must have 45 quarter units of education courses after they earned their bachelors degree. All these "fifth-year" courses can be part of your masters program and may be taken by any graduate student.

\* **TED 5002** (3) Advanced Study of Health Education – offered in Concord every Summer and Fall. Note: In 2004-2005, this class will be 2 units. It is required for a Ryan Act Clear Credential.

\* **TED 5120** (4) Classroom Computer Technologies II – offered in Concord every Summer and Fall. Note: If you have a Ryan Act Credential awarded after 7/1/02, you will need to take TED 5110 and TED 5120. Holders of SB 2042 Credentials need only take TED 5120 if they are pursuing their Clear Credential through a fifth-year of study.

\* **TED 5500** (4) Advanced Study of Teaching Special Populations – offered in Concord every Summer and Winter. It is also required for the Ryan Act Clear Credential.

\* **TED 5620** (4) Advanced Study of Teaching English Learners – offered in Concord every Summer and Spring starting the Summer of 2005

## **Courses for Students in SB 2042 Induction Programs/Saturdays in Hayward (12 units)**

Most teachers with new, SB 2042 Multiple Subject and Single Subject Credentials will earn their Professional Clear Credential by participating in school district induction programs. We have designed six 2-unit courses that will correspond to your experiences in an induction program. Please note, however, that any graduate student may enroll in any of these courses. You may take as many or as few of these courses as you wish. All are offered at the Hayward campus on three Saturdays each quarter:

\* **TED 5700** (2) Supportive Environment for Student Learning – first offered in the Fall of 2004

\* **TED 5702** (2) Assessing Instructional Experiences – first offered in the Winter of 2005

\* **TED 5703** (2) Instructional Planning: The Lesson – first offered in the Spring of 2005

\* **TED 5704** (2) Standards-Based Instruction – first offered in the Fall of 2005

\* **TED 5705** (2) Instructional: The Unit – first offered in the Winter of 2006

\* **TED 5706** (2) Standards-Based Assessment – first offered in Spring of 2006

## **MS in Education, Option in Curriculum, Patterns on the Hayward Campus**

You may choose from many other Teacher Education graduate-level courses offered on the Hayward campus. The courses are organized under five patterns: children's literature; elementary education, environmental education, mathematics education, and science/health education.
